The Department of Science and Technology -Science and Technology Information Institute (DOST-STII), established in 1987 through Executive Order No. 128, is the information and marketing arm of the DOST. The DOST-STII is primarily tasked with providing S&T information services and advocacy, and S&T information reference services through its library.

DOST-STII implements its mandates through the two major programs:

A. Operation of Science and Technology Center for Information Services

- Library operations covering multimedia materials acquisitions, cataloging, and reader's services classification
- Literature search, reference, and referral services

- Training and consultancy on IT, S&T information handling, processing and services

B. Science and Technology Promotion and Advocacy Services

- Production of media guides, posters, and customized promotional materials;

Pressure is privilege.

We struggled through 2022, with the COVID pandemic still inexorably in our midst, and Commission on Audit (COA) observing that we missed some of our deliverables at year-end. Understandable but inexcusable, that seems to be the final verdict. And yet we should not lose sight of the fruits of our struggle:

- 1. We reached 30M through social media engagement.
- 2. We produced media mileage worth 21B in PR and Media Value.
- 3. The SWS Survey of the national awareness level of science, technology and innovation information reached an all-time high of 47% (Dec 2022) up 683% from 6% when we started the survey in 2017.
- DOST-STII topped all DOST agencies in internal control systems for financial management as assessed by the Internal Audit Service.
- 5. We achieved 3rd place among DOST agencies in the DOST GAD Mainstreaming Awards (June 2022).
- 6. We attained Level 2 in the PRIME HRM program of the CSC, among only 37 government agencies being groomed for Level 3.
- 7. We garnered 100% in all indicators in the BAR 1 (2022).
- 8. We received from the UPLB Broadcasters Society the Gandingan Awards for DOSTV 2022 (major award and core awards).

- 9. STARBOOKS was a finalist for Government Best Practice Recognition of the Development Academy of the Philippines (2022).
- 10. The National Priority Plan 2022 of the National Economic Development Authority included STARBOOKS (7th year) and DOSTV (6th year).
- 11. We updated the DOST-STII Strategy Map, Mission and Vision (2022).
- 12. STARBOOKS was a regional winner of the CSC Presidential Lingkod Bayan Award (2022), the highest recognition category by the Civil Service Commission.
- 13. We paid out the Performance-Based Bonus to our employees for the unprecedented 13th consecutive year!

All this could only mean we did not drop the ball amidst all the challenges that beset us. We were driven despite all the distractions. We did not win all the medals out there in the field but, what the heck, we kept right on winning!

Not all organizations or relationships make it past their 7th anniversary (that is the origin of the euphemism of the seven-year itch). We clearly made it and we made it epic.

It is said that "resilience" is the word of 2022, indeed, the institute was able to withstand and recover from the difficulties brought by the pandemic by being driven despite disruptions, which resonates to this year's performance in the quarterly physical report of operation of the institute with 329% increase in the number of promotion services and advocacy activities conducted; and 63% increase in the number of

STARBOOKS sites installed this year which has been below the target for the past two years due to the pandemic.

Moreso, two major programs of the institute namely, STARBOOKS and DOSTv, are again included in the 2022 National Priority Plan of the National Economic and Development Authority garnering 13M and 7.5M worth of donations/sponsorship, respectively. Both programs continue to win many awards and accolades here and abroad.

The institute also topped all DOST agencies in internal control systems for financial management assessed by the Internal Audit Service, ranked #3 in gender mainstreaming, attained level 2 in the PRIME HRM program of the Civil Service Commission and among the only 37 government agencies being groomed for level 3 and an outstanding financial performance metrics of 98% in obligation rate and 97% in disbursement rate for 2022.

As a result, the national awareness level about science, technology and innovation information has unbelievably grown from 6% in 2017 to 47% in 2022.

Gender and Development

With the institutionalization of the DOST-STII Gender and Development Agenda 2021-2026 along with the endorsement of the 2022 GAD Plan and Budget, the Institute continues to uphold its commitment in mainstreaming gender and development.

Following the Gender Mainstreaming Evaluation Framework (GMEF), policies such as the GAD Mainstreaming Program, Sex Disaggregated Data Policy, Gender Fair Language Checker Tool Policy, Breastfeeding in the Workplace Policy, the Committee on Decorum and Investigation (CODI) on Sexual Harassment Cases Manual, and the creation of the GAD Language Checker

Committee were installed to ensure the permanence of gender mainstreaming.

We have capacitated 100% of our people through Gender Sensitivity Training and an Orientation on Gender-Based Sexual Harassment in the workplace. The CODI members were trained on their roles, responsibilities, and skills as an investigator of sexual harassment cases. Our clients were also introduced to GAD concepts through our Online Library Literacy Program and through a hybrid seminar as part of Library and Information Services Month. Students, as well as STARBOOKS Deployment Officers were also oriented on the use of Gender-Fair Language through seminars and training.



Continuous improvement in the SDD Database and the GAD Language Checker Tool as well as enhancements in the Gender-Neutral Restroom and the Mother and Child Care Center were also accomplished in 2022. Meanwhile, various promotional activities in support of GAD mainstreaming were also initiated in different social media pages managed by the institute. The collection of GAD-related materials in the library grew with the acquisition of seven new book titles and the repackaging of Precalculus lessons for the deaf and hearing-impaired users of STARBOOKS.

DOST-STII was also the first DOST agency to conduct the GAD Focal Point System (GFPS) Functionality Assessment Tool, a tool used to examine the performance and level of compliance of an agency GFPS, earning a rating of 57.35 or the Established Level. Dir. Burgos was invited to share the DOST-STII's best practices in using the tool as well as the agency GAD journey at the DOST-wide GAD Assembly attended by the GFPS of all the DOST agencies.

For its 2022 efforts, DOST-STII was awarded 3rd in the Agency Category of the DOST GAD Mainstreaming Awards and has more than doubled its GAD expenditure from 8.26% in 2021 to 17.01% this 2022, which were both more than the required 5% expenditure provided in the Magna Carta of Women.

Improvement of the ICT Facility

Server Room Rehabilitation

The project on rehabilitating the server room was successfully completed during the reported period. The previously cramped 16x8ft space has been expanded to 18x28ft, providing muchneeded additional space for the organization's server equipment and operations. A storage area of 18x10ft was also added to the room, providing a dedicated space for the storage of server-related equipment and supplies.

One of the key accomplishments of this project was the improvement of the room's ceilings and wiring. Dilapidated ceilings were replaced, and new, modern wiring was installed to ensure the safe and efficient operation of the organization's servers.









Additionally, glass wall partitions were installed throughout the server room, providing visibility and better monitoring of the servers and equipment. This has greatly improved the organization's ability to quickly and effectively respond to any issues that may arise with the servers.

Overall, the rehabilitation of the server room has greatly improved the organization's ability to operate and maintain its server equipment. The additional space and improved infrastructure will help to ensure the continued safe and efficient operation of the organization's servers, and will support the organization's growth and operations in the future.

Local Area Network Re-wiring

The rehabilitating the network wiring in the organization was successfully completed during the first semester. The previous network wiring, which was outdated and generally had been damaged by vermin infestation was upgraded and reconfigured to use CAT6 cables, providing better bandwidth and network speed.

One of the key purposes of this project was the tailoring of the rewiring to match the division's new office orientation and setup. This has greatly improved the organization's ability to manage the network and has helped ensure that all users have access to the necessary resources and services easily and efficiently.

The new CAT6 cables provide higher bandwidth and speed compared to the previous CAT5 cables, which will help to support the organization's growing data needs and improve overall network performance. It also allows for future-proofing, in case the organization needs to upgrade to even faster network standards in the future.

With this, the rehabilitation of the network wiring has greatly improved the organization's network infrastructure and has supported the organization's growth and operations. The new wiring will help to ensure the continued efficient and reliable operation of the organization's network, and will support the organization's growth and operations in the future.

Positive disruption – this is how the Information Resources and Analysis Division or IRAD shaped its year by demonstrating education and learning are limitless as the country commences its momentum from the detriment of the pandemic. From a new collection of physical and digital references and publications, arrays of learning and development activities, sealed new partnerships, and skyrocketing presence in social media, IRAD remained steadfast in its mission to disseminate science, technology, and innovation (STI) information.

Empowering the minds through leveled up library experience

As the DOST-STII has finally adjusted to the new and alternative platforms of the library, so as to the demand of its clients when it comes to S&T reference materials, learning and development

intervention, and online library access. In 2022, DOST-STII Library accommodated a total of 116,349 library clients. Far from over a million mark in 2021, this recent number of library clients resulted from a change of metrics used in online library platforms (i.e., from webalyzer that counts website visits to Google Analytics that counts actual users).

It was indeed a productive year for IRAD as it reached an overall rating of 93% Very Satisfactory or higher from 10,431 clients (from 26 schools and institutions) who availed of Online Library Literacy Program; 8,061 clients from 17 library webinars, trainings, and workshops; 288 material requests; 402 clients (from 18 different schools and institutions) for walk-in, tour, and benchmarking activities; and 97,167 users through ScINet Integrated Library Management System - Online Public Access Catalog (SILMS-OPAC).

IRAD continued to campaign its flagship service—S&T library—by increasing its vast collection of STI reference materials. In 2022, a total of **186 titles** and **360 copies of newly-acquired books (102 titles / 107 copies) and serials (84 titles / 253 copies)** were technically processed.

Likewise, the Digitization Section **scanned 255,540 pages** from 1,894 titles, **transfigured 41,969 OCR-ready pages** on Filipiniana materials and **uploaded 1,312 full-text articles** on Philippine e-library and SILMS databases.

Reinforcing library services with profuse STI content

Last year, IRAD fulfilled a total of **2,102 Filipiniana** and foreign titles to the SILMS database, **1,898** new records in STARBOOKS content, **1,063** experts and scientists' profiles registered in SPHERES website, and three semi-annual publications, namely: the Philippine Science and Technology Abstracts (PSTA), Specialized Philippine Enterprise Reference of Experts and Scientists (SPHERES), and STARBOOKS Insider.

The PSTA is a collection of classified abstracts of S&T information from journals and periodicals. Meanwhle, on the other hand, SPHERES is a compilation of bibliographical information on the experts and scientists specializing in science and

technology; while STARBOOKS Insider is a special newsletter featuring STARBOOKS-related activities.

Likewise, STARBOOKS (81,845 users), Science. ph (44,093 users), and SPHERES (52,881 users) showed impressive website users for 2022.

As part of continued efforts to provide readily-accessible Agriculture, Aquatic and Natural Resources (AANR) resources, IRAD still collaborated with DOST-PCAARRD and its regional consortia with the project titled "Accelerating DOST-PCAARRD Knowledge Networks of e-Libraries" to digitize 274,941 pages of AANR resources available through a digital information hub called SLIMS database.


Keeping the social media presence ablaze

IRAD kept up the momentum going in the world of social media through DOST-STII Library and STARBOOKS Facebook pages. In 2022, DOST-STII Library Facebook page achieved 1,085,635 total reach with 462 contents exhibiting monthly features of newly-processed reference materials, PSTA abstracts, Filipina scientists in SPHERES, and announcements; while STARBOOKS Facebook page had 8,164,300 total reach with 120 contents featuring STARBOOKS activities, online quizzes, and announcements to name a few.






Philippine Science and Technology Abstracts (PSTA) June and December 2022 Issues

IRAD also supported the campaign for R.A. 10535, also known as the **Philippine Standard Time**.

The revamped **DOST InfoSerbilis** continued to improve its services by creating a chatbot about DOST Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) like scholarship, laboratory services, DOST products, and contact details of different DOST agencies. In 2022, **DOST InfoSerbilis received 1,514 queries (i.e., 84.63% higher than in 2021).** Moreover, **97.36% of the clients rated their online experience as Very Satisfactory or higher**.

DOST InfoSerbilis is a fast, accurate, and clientoriented platform that answers DOST-related queries such as general information on DOST and its agencies; DOST key officials; DOST programs, projects, and activities; scholarship applications; and laboratory services.


STARBOOKS@11: Mga Istorya ng Inspirasyon

Aside from the offline kiosk of STARBOOKS, its resources can also be accessed online through its website and mobile applications:





STARBOOKS deployment officers assembly

As restrictions eased out in 2022, STARBOOKS finally conducted, face-to-face, its 9th and 10th STARBOOKS Deployment Officers Assembly after two years of holding it virtually. Held at The Heritage Hotel Manila on May 18-20 and November 23-25, respectively, both assembly discussed the plans and updates for STARBOOKS programs, and shared the best practices and resources among STARBOOKS Deployment Officers for the successful implementation of the project in the regions.

Continued collaboration: STARBOOKS training with DepEd



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This year, the CRPD ramped up its science and technology (S&T) communication efforts by means of social media posts, press releases, and other publicity campaigns . . .



S&T Promotion Services

This year, the Communication Resources and Production Division (CRPD) ramped up its science and technology (S&T) communication efforts by means of social media posts and press releases under the banner of the following publicity campaigns:

- Oras Pinas awareness drive in January,
- Rizal the Filipino Scientist commemorative webinars from January to June,
- Project #MAGHANDA learning sessions

- on disaster information from July to December in collaboration with DOST-PAGASA and DOST-PHIVOLCS, and
- the 7th National Research & Development Conference in September.

In effect, the number of regular social media posts rose by 2% to 4,725 this year from 4,621 in 2021. Relative to 2021, social media engagements slid by 38% (from 50,434,344 to 31,441,980), as did the social media reach (from 30,053,325 to 29,736,592) due to some unexpected events. These posts were published in the official social media accounts managed by CRPD:











- DOST-Science and Technology Information Institute (Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter),
- DOST-Philippines (Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter),
- Science Journo Ako (Facebook),
- Philippine Journal of Science (Facebook), and
- National Science and Technology Week (Facebook).

As for the promotion of this year's National Science and Technology Week (NSTW), with the number of social media posts having declined by 70% from 509 in 2021 to 152 this year, social media engagements *via* Facebook also dropped by 47% from 4,387,357 to 2,326,750. On

a positive note, social media reach soared by 432% to 712,657 this year from 134,043 in 2021 for webinars and by 3% to 1,613,760 from 1,567,998 for posts. Although the number of press releases decreased by 84% from 82 in 2021 to 13 this year due to shift in the human resource deployment, the number of views for the NSTW website did roll up by 7% from 14,698 to 15,767.

Science Journo *Ako* did well this year, as six (6) sessions were conducted in total:

 "Enhancing Science Communication Skills with Gender Lens" co-organized by ASMEPPS (Association of Science and Mathematics Educators of Philippine Private Schools) in April via the Zoom Meetings platform—with Ms. Ruby Shaira

- F. Panela and Dr. Mary Barby P. Badayos-Jover as resource persons to 210 participants;
- "Communicating Science through Social Media Posting and Digital Broadcasting" co-organized by ASMEPPS in July at St. Francis of Assisi College-Bacoor Campus—with Ms. Jachin Jane O. Aberilla, Mr. Lanquin Seyer Gacusan, and Mrs. Carmela P. Aguisanda-de Gracia as resource persons to 65 participants;
- "Virtual Training on Social Media Marketing and Basic Infographics for MSMEs of Agusan del Norte, Agusan del Sur, and Dinagat Islands" co-organized by DOST-Caraga in July via the Zoom Meetings platform—with Ms. Jachin Jane O. Aberilla and Mrs. Carmela P. Aguisandade Gracia as resource persons to 50 participants;
- "Art and Science in Science
 Communication" co-organized by
 Batangas State University in September
 via the Zoom Meetings platform—with
 Dr. Ruby Roan Cristobal as the resource
 person to 34 participants;

- "#ScienceJournoAko: Popularizing
 Science Stories" co-organized by PIPAC
 (Philippine Institute for Pure and Applied
 Chemistry) in September via the Zoom
 Meetings platform—with Mr. Rodolfo P. de
 Guzman as the resource person to 54
 participants; and
- "Ano ang Kwento Mo? Popular Writing for Everyl" conducted for the students of the College of Education's Department of English of the Rizal Technological University (RTU) in October 27 via the Google Meet platform—with Mr. Rodolfo P. de Guzman as the resource person to 32 participants.

Overall, the number of press and photo releases plus articles fell by 23% from 183 in 2021 to 141 this year. These were prepared for both external dissemination and internal publication—the latter of which includes the S&T Post, which had four (4) issues published this year. Others included e-newsletters—namely, DOST Digest and *Balitang* RapiDOST each with 12 issues published, an innovative approach to reach more readers using the digital platform.





The S&T Post won the top honors for the article titled "Fides in Scientia: Faithfully Serving the Nation through Science" written by Allyster A. Endozo at the 16th Gandingan Awards of the UP Community Broadcasters' Society, which was aired via its official Facebook page in April. The article, which was published in the magazine's first quarter 2021 issue, bested all entries in the Most Development-oriented Online Feature Article Category—the first in the 40-year history of the magazine.

From 234 in 2021, the number of peer-reviewed articles published in PJS went down slightly by 7% to 218 this year. However, there was a slight uptick in the number of manuscripts received to 347 this year from 336 in 2021. Due to the heavy workload, the average duration of peer review extended by more than half from around 82 days in 2021 to around 122 days this year.

To accommodate the sustained pile-up in manuscripts received and articles published, as in 2021, the number of issues published was kept at seven this year:

- Vol. 151 No. 1 (February 2022 Issue),
- Vol. 151 No. 2 (April 2022 Issue),
- Vol. 151 No. 3 (June 2022 Issue),
- Vol. 151 No. S1 (Special Issue on Philippine Marine Botanical Research),
- Vol. 151 No. 4 (August 2022 Issue),
- Vol. 151 No. 5 (October 2022 Issue), and
- Vol. 151 Nos. 6A and B (December 2022 Issue Parts A and B).

Media Engagements

This year, the number of pressers, radio and television interviews, plus other media engagements rose by 4% to 457 compared to 440 in 2021. A marked slump in S&T news dissemination was reported this year: 33% *via* radio (from 2,838 to 1,888) and 21% *via* online platform (from 27,323 to 21,689). Nonetheless, gains by 6% *via* television (from 2,436 to 2,594) and 4% *via* print media (from 4,521 to 4,694) were also noted. Amazingly, however, S&T news

generated close to PHP 21 billion in media value this year, which was almost PHP 7.2 billion more or 52% higher than nearly PHP 13.81 billion in 2021.

The three most popular news articles published this year were as follows:

- "DOST-backed mall exhibit series highlights SM Prime's sustainability, DRR journey" with 53 media pick-ups generating PHP 9.17 million in media value;
- "UP researchers recommend lagundi for COVID-19 patients" with 11 media pickups generating PHP 8.68 million in media value; and
- "DRR experts: science and technology key to addressing disasters, mitigating its effects in Asia-Pacific" with 12 media pickups generating PHP 7.16 million in media value.

Among those representing the DOST as spokespersons, the former Secretary Fortunato T. de la Peña held a 36% share in media exposure this year, which was a decline by 30 percentage points from 66% in 2021. The new Secretary, Dr. Renato U. Solidum Jr., having been appointed by President Ferdinand "Bongbong" Marcos Jr. in August, saw his share more than quadruple from 13% in 2021 to 57% this year in review. The former Undersecretary for Research and Development Dr. Rowena Cristina L. Guevara maintained the third spot with a 7% share, although this was 13 percentage points lower from 20% in 2021.

An 89% rise was noted in the use of the #ScienceForThePeople hashtag: from 4,520 in 2021 to 8,551 this year. As for the new #OneDOST4U hashtag attributed to the new administration, the figure was 3,950 this year.

As with the previous years, a year-end thanksgiving activity was conducted with media practitioners in December this year, thereby gaining enough public relations mileage for the Institute, as well as for the DOST in general.

DOSTv: Science for the People

DOSTv attracted over 47.48 million more visits to its Facebook page, which grew from 255,039,277 in 2021 to 302,521,939 this year. But as the number of aired episodes fell by 29% (from 357 to 253), naturally, the corresponding number of views dipped by 25% (from 3,055,856 to 2,296,461), as expected. Despite these, the total and organic audience reach increased by 8% (from 8,406,055 to 9,074,611) and 23% (from 76,250,429 to 93,820,165), respectively.

More or less, the weekly DOST Report program had the same number of episodes aired at 51 this year *versus* 52 in 2021. Surprisingly, compared to 2021, the program heaved massive gains in terms of views by 150% (from 593,323 to 1,485,716), engagements by 42% (from 149,757 to 213,303), and audience reach by 18% (from 2,625,277 to 3,090,513).

As in 2021, ExperTalk Online has 52 episodes aired this year, but its recent performance is far from the same. In fact, the program enjoyed 730% higher views (from 197,580 to 1,640,647), 431% greater audience reach (from 531,286 to 2,818,873), and 129% more engagements (from 18,973 to 43,419).

As testaments to its pursuit of excellence, six trophies were hauled in by DOSTv in various categories at the 16th *Gandingan* Awards of the UP Community Broadcasters' Society:

- Gandingan ng Kaunlaran: Most

- Most Development-oriented Science and Technology Program (DOST Report Episode 48: DOST Drug Discovery in the New Normal), and
- Gandingan ng Agham at Teknolohiya: Special Citation (DOST Secretary Fortunato T. de la Peña).

S&T Awareness

The Social Weather Station year-end survey involving a combined 1,200 Filipino adults based in Metro Manila, Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao reflected the level of public awareness on S&T at 47%, a surge of 23 percentage points from 24% in 2021.

The top DOST programs on research and development (R&D) this year were as follows:

- · S&T scholarship program with 23%,
- STARBOOKS (Science and Technology
 Academic and Research-Based Openly-

Operated KioskS) with 3%, and

IPRAP (Intellectual Property Rights
 Assistance Program (IPRAP) with 2%.

The top DOST programs on household, community, and livelihood this year were as follows:

- ADMATEL (Advanced Device and Materials Testing Laboratory) with 11%,
- CEST (Community Empowerment thru Science and Technology) with 9%,
- eNutribun (Enhanced Nutribun) with 9%, and
- SETUP (Small Enterprise Technology Upgrading Program) with 4%.

The top DOST programs against COVID-19 this year were as follows:

- VCO (virgin coconut oil) with 46%,
- tawa-tawa with 43%,
- lagundi with 36%, and
- mix-and-match vaccine with 34%.



From +34 in 2021, the net satisfaction rating of the DOST climbed by 21 percentage points to +55 this year.

AV Services

For audiovisual (AV) services, the number of requests formally received more than doubled to 356 this year from 153 in 2021, as pandemic protocols began to ease up in 2022. Among those requested were 32 video edits; 125 photo coverages; 106 video coverages; 57 AV technical setups for CCTV and audio-video; 15 photo shoots; 14 video shoots; five (5) written scripts; one (1) AV production in script-to-screen, preand post-production, or slideshow presentation form; and one (1) clean-cut video reproduction.


Not to be outdone, the number of AV services actually delivered this year was 488—a 35% rise from 361 in 2021. This was way above the 356 requests formally received this year, thus placing the accomplishment rate at around 137%. Among those delivered were 155 video edits; 126 photo

coverages; 107 video coverages; 37 AV technical setups for CCTV and audio-video; 18 photo shoots; 15 video shoots; five (5) written scripts; one (1) AV production in script-to-screen, preand post-production, or slideshow presentation form; and one (1) clean-cut video reproduction.

Of the 125 feedback forms retrieved from clients this year, 90 (72%) had a modal rating of "5" or "very satisfied," whereas the rest (28%) had no rating indicated.

Partnerships and Collaborations

This year, the DOST-STII forged partnerships with 16 private and public sector stakeholders-namely, ASMEPPS, PIPAC, CNN Philippines, EdukSine, DOST-Caraga, Rizal Technological University, Association of Special Libraries of the Philippines, Bulacan State University, University of Perpetual Help System Laguna, ABS-CBN Lingkod Kapamilya Foundation, Inc., DOST-ASTI, Indang Cavite Highlands 10, Lions Club, Turkish





Cooperation and Coordination Agency, Kaisipan, Inc., and Pagbilao Energy Corporation, Pagbilao Quezon LGU.

ASMEPPS, PIPAC, DOST-Caraga, and RTU served as co-organizers of the Science Journo *Ako* sessions conducted this year.

PIA, PNA, and RPI benefited from science, technology, and innovation contents in the form of press releases—as well as from interview arrangements through connections with various DOST agencies.

The Manila Times agreed to cross-post the broadcasts of DOSTv segments on their official Facebook account, thereby increasing the reach of DOSTv programs. To seal the partnership, a formal memorandum of agreement was initially scheduled during the year in review; however, it was moved for the next year due to conflict of schedules of principal signatories.

CNN Philippines partnered to produce an S&T

segment on their program—The Final Word anchored by seasoned broadcaster, Rico Hizon. CNN Philippines also offered a discounted airing cost for ExperTalk.

Outcomm Media Inc. provided a buy-1-get-3 LED spot for DOSTv and NSTW.

EdukSine, a private film advocacy company, is poised to create a free web page on its website as an additional platform for DOSTv programs (*Siyensikat* and *Sinesiyensya*), as a result of a formal agreement inked to collaborate and promote science, technology, and innovation through then use of visual communication.

Decrease in reach & engagements may be attributed to the lack of designated social media staff to maintain the socmed pages starting October 2022. the remaining staff at CDES-CRPD divided the socmed tasks among themselves on top of their regular load & preparation of the face-to-face conduct of NSTW 2022

Conducted five (5) campaign activities within the year representing 20% higher than target of 4:

- 1. press release on Oras Pinas produced and disseminated,
- 2. conceptualized/produced tagline & content calendar for Oras Pinas,
- 3. produced social media posts on Oras Pinas,
- 4. produced teaser Ad on Oras Pinas, and
- 5. produced full thematic AVP on Oras Pinas

Decrease in produced PRs may be attributed to the lack of full time writers at CDES-CRPD, however, semestral target of 66 PRs produced maintains to be met, if not exceeded, in 2022

The DOST-STII has maintained an exceptional financial performance in 2022. As of 31 December 2022, the Obligation Budget Utilization Rate is 97.45%, while the Disbursement Budget Utilization Rate is 88.39%.



Outstanding financial performance through the years

The DOST-STII has maintained an exceptional financial performance in 2022. As of 31 December 2022, the Obligation Budget Utilization Rate, which is the percentage of obligations over the total allotment is 97.45% (P113,202,147.46 /P116,164,965.10), while the Disbursement Budget Utilization Rate, which is the percentage of disbursement (current year and continuing appropriations) over obligations is 88.39% (P100,060,607.53/P113,202,147.46). The disbursement rate over Notice of Cash Allocation (NCA) is 97.10% (P110,119,174.54/P113,741,984.26) which is the total disbursement for the year over the total NCA released. The difference is due to the non-release of NCA to settle due and demandable obligations, especially the prior year's Accounts Payable, which has zero NCA release and was paid using current year allocations. Other obligated items were not yet delivered/fulfilled by the suppliers, leaving total Accounts Payable amounting to P13,058,516.74.

ISO 9001:2015 Recertification

Another gain under the Quality Management System (QMS) of the DOST-STII is its recertification under ISO 9001:2015.

The agency has successfully passed the rigid external audit conducted by the DQS Certification Philippines, Inc. on 10 November 2022, where the management system is observed to be fully effective and fulfills the requirements of the applied standard(s) with no non-conformities identified and four (4) strengths recognized, to wit, 1.) Competency and Awareness - Highly commendable that the HR team is in progress in the Enhancement of the Competency Framework on linking with the functional objectives and IPCR. 2.) Top Management; Management Review - Very commendable on the innovations, that the organization is adapting digital platforms on the

processes and services provided to their clients.
3.) The Top Management is highly commendable on the full support and commitment to the effectiveness of the management system and
4.) FAD - Finance - Automated Finance working templates (excel) - minimizing human errors, avoiding reworks, ensuring the accuracy of reports, and saving time in the processing of payment.

The DOST-STII was first certified in 2018, recertified last 2021, and passed the required annual surveillance audit for 2022.

Highest audit rating from COA

For the third time, the Agency received an Unqualified Opinion for the agency's audited financial statement as of 31 December 2021 based on the Annual Audit Reports (AAR) released by the Commission on Audit on 05 April 2022. This is the highest audit rating given by the Commission to an agency that certifies the financial statements submitted as fairly presented, in all material respects based on the audit evidence obtained, in accordance with the International Public Sector Accounting Standards (IPSAS).

Compliance to COA's Audit Recommendation

Pursuant to the Performance Based Bonus Guidelines, to improve the agency's internal control processes, enhance operational effectiveness, and eliminate, resolve, and remedy most, if not all, of the agency audit findings, the agency should fully implement 30% of the prior years' audit recommendations as shown in the Report on Status of Implementation of Prior Years' Recommendations. These recommendations will exclude the Property, Plant, and Equipment (PPE)-related items of the Annual Audit Report (AAR). As of December 31, 2022, DOST-STII was able to fully implement 9 out of 14 or 64% of non-PPE-related



Audit Recommendations of the Commission on Audit for the year 2021.

Compliance with the Freedom of Information Act

The DOST-STII remains 100% compliant with the Freedom of Information (FOI) Program. Agency Information Inventory, 2022 FOI Registry, and 2022 FOI Summary Report were updated, accordingly. The institute's dashboard has already been linked in the electronic FOI (eFOI) portal (www. foi.gov.ph) as required by the Presidential Communications Operations Office (PCOO).

Building the future of DOST-STII through the next gen of leaders

Leadership development has brought various positive benefits to DOST-STII. Division managers and section supervisors were continuously capacitated since 2017 to ensure they lead their respective team effectively.

This year, the DOST-STII shifted its focus to employees who are considered next-in-rank of supervisory positions and have the potential to be the institute's future leaders. A total of 15 employees were carefully screened by the Succession Development Committee, and selected to attend the four-day training on Basic Leadership Development Program (BLDP) that runs from September 12 – 15, 2022. The goal is to strengthen the DOST-STII leadership pipeline who will achieve its vision in years to come.

The BLDP was conducted face-to-face at the Acacia Hotel. Activities were slightly modified to optimize the use of technology and to manage group interaction. It was facilitated by Dr. Mary Margaret Que (Days 1 and 2) and Mr. Denver Bingski Daradar (Days 3 and 4) of ExeQ Consulting Service.

Overall, the program received a rating of 4.78 over 5. The participants expressed gratitude and satisfaction for learning the different roles of a leader.











Increasing competencies for better work performance

Learning is an endless process. By learning, we grow personally and professionally. Our growth has a substantial effect in organizational performance, hence, the desire to gain or upgrade one's knowledge of or skill through training or experience should be constantly sought.

In DOST-STII, capacity and capability building are strongly supported by the management because they believe that the most important resource of the institute is the human resource.

For 2022, qualified employees were sent to various external training programs and webinars, which corresponds to the competency requirements of the job they hold. Meanwhile, two in-house training programs were conducted in partnership with the divisions-in-charge.

Last 7-8 September 2022, Mr. Ivan Burcer of BizCore facilitated the training titled, "Business Correspondences That Work". The purpose of this training was to improve the business writing skills of employees and contract of service staff. A total of 40 were in attendance.

The second training facilitated by Mr. Burcer was the Training on Presentation Skills: Powerful Professional Presentations, which was held on 24 October and 3 November 2022. This training intended to build the oral presentation skill of employees to make it more compelling and effective. Thirty four (34) participants benefited from this activity.



Rewards and recognition: celebrating employees' excellence and milestones

On 11 January 2022, the revised DOST-STII
Program on Awards and Incentives for Service
Excellence (PRAISE) was approved by the Civil
Service Commission – National Capital Region.
Among the changes in the Program are the
inclusion of new awards—Retirement Award,
Gantimpala-Agad Award, Achievement Award,
5S Compliance Award, Innovation Award and "U"
Make a Difference Award—and the revision of the
categories for the Directors Award.

As such, for the fifth year of implementation of the DOST-STII PRAISE, four (4) employees were conferred with Director's Award for their notable performance and behavior for CY 2021, six (6) were recognized as Director's Award nominees, six (6) were presented with the Loyalty Award, and one (1) was given the Retirement Award. Additionally, eight (8) teams and ten (10) individuals were commended for their dedication to duty, for performing duties on top of their official functions and for rising above the challenges in the middle of the pandemic.

Four (4) teams were also commended for their best practices that were lauded by the external auditors during the last ISO Recertification Audit, ten (10) were presented with the "U" Make a Difference Award, five (5) were given the Innovation Award, and three (3) were granted with the Achievement Award.

The "Strongest Link Award" was given to two (2) DOST-STII exemplars to recognize their outstanding and significant contributions to the Institute. The Award consists of a gold chain procured by the Director himself and conferred as a highlight of the PRAISE Awards Ceremony.

Last 24 February 2022, the exemplars and loyalty awardees were recognized with a Plaque of Recognition/Certificate and/or modest cash award during the 35th DOST-STII Anniversary which was held at Sofitel Philippine Plaza Manila. The ceremony was graced by various partners and stakeholders, was also publicized via Zoom and Facebook livestream, and was watched by almost 1,600 viewers.

STARBOOKS bagged external recognitions

STARBOOKS has brought another pride to DOST-STII by winning in regional level of the Presidential Lingkod Bayan Award on 30 June 2022, and by securing one of the top fourteen (14) slots from the two hundred nineteen (219) entries for the Government Best Practice Recognition (GBPR) 2022.

The DOST-STII PRAISE Committee recommended the nomination of STARBOOKS, both for the Civil Service Commission - Honor Awards Program and Development Academy of the Philippines' Government Best Practice Recognition (GBPR).

Sustaining a safe and healthy workplace

The journey to make the DOST-STII a safe and healthy workplace started in 2020 upon the the issuance of CSC-DOH-DOLE Joint Circular No. I series of 2020 was released for adoption of all government agencies. Various policies that solidify the implementation of Occupational Safety and Health in the institute were approved in 2021.

Come 2022, the Occupational Safety and Health (OSH) Committee carried on its duties through conducting the following activities geared towards improving and maintaining healthy workforce:

 HIV-AIDS and Hepatitis B Awareness Program
 May 2022

As part of the agency's compliance to Department of Labor and Employment Advisory No. 05, Series of 2010 (Guidelines for the Implementation of a Workplace Policy and Program on Hepatitis B) and Republic Act No. 8504 (Philippine AIDS Prevention and Control Act of 1998), this activity was held in an aim to raise



awareness on the diagnosis, treatment and prevention of hepatitis B and HIV/AIDS in the workplace.

The first part was the seminar attended by 67 employees. Ms. Anya Malapit, an HIV Counselor, Case Manager and Phlebotomist of Taguig Social Hygiene Clinic and Drop-in Center served as the resource speaker.

This was followed by a Screening Test and Counseling, which were free of charge. Results were released directly to the employees.

 Drug-Free Workplace Orientation and Mandatory Random Drug Testing 14 July 2022

This activity was in support of the government's campaign against dangerous drugs in compliance with the Dangerous Drugs Board Regulation No. 13 s. 2018 or the "Establishment and Institutionalization of Drug-Free Workplace Policies in All Government Offices,





Including the Conduct of Authorized Drug Testing for Elective Local Officials and Appointive Public Officers and for Other Purposes, and Civil Service Commission Memorandum Circular 13 series of 2017 or the Guidelines in the Mandatory Drug Test for the Public Officials and Employees and for Other Purpose.

Two resource speakers from the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA) National Capital Region Office were sent to deepen the employees understanding on dangerous drugs, Mr. Paulo Victor A. Daculla, Supervising Administrative Officer and Mr. Vlain Alfred M. Canlas, Information Officer III. The activity was attended by 68 employees.

3. Awareness Lecture on Tuberculosis and Anti-Smoking21 September 2022

In compliance with the Executive Order
No. 187 and Order No. 73-05 of the
DOLE instituting a Comprehensive and
Unified Policy for TB Control; and with
Civil Service Commission (CSC) MC No.
17, s. 2009 (Smoking Prohibition based
on 100% Smoke-Free Policy), this activity
was initiated. Also, it aimed to increase
awareness and knowledge of participants

on Tuberculosis (TB), which can contribute to early case detection, reducing stigma and discrimination. This will also address some of the risk factors associated with the tuberculosis including diabetes and smoking which can contribute to poor tuberculosis treatment results.

The resource speakers of the event were from the City Health Office of the Local Government Unit of Taguig City. Dr. Maria Rosario Bieren, Medical Coordinator for the National Tuberculosis Program talked about Tuberculosis while Dr. Thelma Co, Medial Coordinator for Non-Communicable Disease handled the topic on Smoking. 56 employees have attended the seminar.

4. Mental Health in the Workplace Seminar 27 October 2022

In pursuit to promote mental health in the workplace, address stigma and discrimination, and provide support to employees who are at risk and/or suffering with mental health conditions, the OSH Committee tapped the City Health Office of the Local Government Unit of Taguig City for the conduct of a seminar to conduct seminar on the



common mental health issues, healthy skills, and lifestyle choices that promotes mental health.

Dr. Wesley A. Quimbo, Psychiatrist of the Taguig City Mental Health Program, graced the activity as a resource speaker. A total of 65 employees were educated on how to keep our psychological health in good shape.

5. COVID-19 Reminders

Because cases of COVID-19 has not totally flattened to zero case a day in the Philippines, Safety Protocols are still installed in the workplace and reminders are persistently given.



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
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
